SALEM WILL HAVE BIG PAPER MILL

C. K. Spaulding Back of Proposition to Establish New Industry at Capital.

C. K. Spaulding, president of the logging company which bears his name, is planning to organize a company to engage in the paper making industry at Salem. Recently he conferred with San Francisco capitalists who are heavily interested in Crown Willamette Paper company, operating mills at Lebanon, Oregon City and Camas and completing a new plant at Ocean Falls, B. C. He feels encouraged sufficiently to carry forward the preliminaries of his project.

"The three requisites of raw materials, power and transportation we have at Salem," said Mr. Spaulding at his company's Portland office. "There is no reason why pulp paper cannot be produced as advantageously there as anywhere on the Pacific Coast. We shall be glad to turn in our steam power facilities and water power rights for stock in a corporation that might be formed to engage in the industry. Already there is abundant cheap electric power at Salem and if more should be required it can be developed within easy transmission distance."

It is known that the International Paper company, capitalized at \$60,000,000 in stock and bonds and operating extensively in the New England states, has taken options on large tracts of spruce and hemlock in Coos county and the western part of Douglas and Lane counties with a view to engaging in the paper making industry on the Pacific Coast. Another indication of the approaching boom in this industry is the activity of representatives of large interests in the Grays Harbor district to install a pulp mill close to Aberdeen.

Whether these interests are in International Paper company or allied with the New York corporation is not positively known, but, in the opinion of Portland men who are keeping in close touch with the situation, there are no conflicting interests among those who are seeking to add to the importance of the paper making industry based on the forest products of Oregon, Washington and British Columbia. An unchallenged fact is said to be that Eastern paper manufacturers see the necessity of developing the industry on the Pacific Coast because of the gradual extinction of raw materials in the New England states and Eastern Canada.

Myrtle Gonzalez Considers "The Chalice of Courage" Greatest Photoplay.

Myrtle Lillian Gonzalez, of the Western Vitagraph Company, who has been seen in a number of big Vitagraph feature productions, places "The Chalice of Courage," Cyrus Townsend Brady's remarkable human interest story, in the front rank of the feature pictures in which she has appeared. After finishing her education she engaged in concert work and was making excellent progress when she attracted the attention of Dick Ferris, who engaged her for his stock company, then playing the Auditorium, Los Angeles, Calif. The ceaseless labor of a stock engagement did not appeal to her and, at the suggestion of Paul De Longpre, an artist of reputation, she applied for and secured a position with the Vitagraph Company. The silent drama did appeal to her sense of the "fitness of things," and she adopted the calling that best fitted her talent, posing for the picturized stories.

Miss Gonzalez has now acted before the camera for some time and has done such excellent work in such

popular stories as "Captain Alvarez," the first big Vitagraph Feature that came from the Western Company; "Deception," "Ghosts," "His Wife and His Work," "The Man From the Desert," "The Sage Brush Gai," "The Chalice of Courage," and other feature pictures produced and photographed by the Western Vitagraph Company.

Miss Gonzalez, like the majority of California girls, likes the open and spends most of her time in the saddle or at the helm of a fast-flying sailboat. While riding and sailing are her chief diversions, she is proficient at tennis, is an exceptional basketball player and can shoot like a hunter. For just simple exercise she takes long walks that sometimes carry her far afield.

Myrtle Gonzalez will appear at the Star Theatre next Sunday and Monday in "The Chalice of Courage." A good comedy reel will also be shown.
