MORE HOMESEEKERS COMING TO THE WEST

Spokane, Wash., March 14 .- "We are advised by the immigration departments of the railroads that there will be more homeseekers headed for the northwest this year than any previous season," is the statement of Chairman M. E. Hay of the Inland mpire Developmena leasue, in an aouncing the annual meeting of the league, to be held in Spokane next Monday, March 19. "We have received nearly 1,000 farm land inquiries since January 1,"

contined Mr. Hay, "which confirms the prediction of the immigration agents. The Inland Empire Development league gives careful attention to all of these inquiries, by furnishing accrute information in regard to the farming districts around Spokane and and directing attention to the most attractive farm land offerings in each locality.

"We especially urge every man interested in the development of the agricultural resources of the Inland Empire to be present at the annual meeting, in the assembly room of the chamber of commerce in Spokane on next Monday. A reduced rate of a fare and third for the round trip to Spokane has been established by all the railroads for this meeting."

Stronger Boxes From Less Material.

That a much stronger box than the type ordinarily used can be made with less material by increasing the number of nails and by properly proportioning the thickness of the sides and ends has been demonstrated by engineers of the Forest Products Laboratory, at Madison, Wisconsin. A loss that reaches many millons of dollars annually is, it is stated, caused by damage to goods in transit. largely because of faulty containers. The wood experts of the Forest Service believe that this loss can be decidedly decreased by better construction of the boxes in which goods are shipped.

Changes in the design of boxes which were recommended as a result of the tests at the Laboratory have been adopted by several associations. It is stated that demonstrations at a recent meeting of the Canner's Association of what has been done by the Forest Service along these lines aroused considerable interest among the manufactures. Many of these men are said to have expressed their intention of carving out the suggestions of the Laboratory experts.
