Sarah Francis Jennings was born in Kentucky in 1854. Her parents immigrated to Missouri and in 1870 she was married to Joseph W. Osborne. They made their home there until 1890 when they came West and located near Cecil, Morrow County, Ore., which place continued to be their home until the morning of May 11, 1917. At about 5 o'clock she succumbed to a sudden attack of asthma that lasted but a few minutes. She seemed conscious that the end had come and triumphantly passed the ordeal in her 64th year.

At an early age she became identified with the supreme Life of Truth and Righteousness to whose inspiring principles she was ardently devoted. Her active Christian life was well known and she will be remembered and cherished by her many friends. Her devoted husband has lost a faithful wife and the community a real neighbor.
