SCHOOL ELECTION HELD.
The annual school meeting for the election of one director and clerk was held on Monday afternoon at the council rooms. W. B. Barratt was elected director without opposition, while Vawter Crawford was chosen clerk over J. A. Waters, these two being placed in nomination for the position before the meeting. As usual, where there is no particular issue up the interest was nil, and only fifteen votes were polled.

The annual report of retiring Clerk Hill was read and accepted. A summary of this report shows: Balance on hand at the time of making last annual report, June, 1916, \$1660.58; received from County Treasurer from district tax, \$14,180.75; received from County Treasurer from county school fund, \$2509.30; received from County Treasurer from State school fund, \$589.41; received from county high school fund \$2063.18; received from all other sources, \$1300.17; total, \$26,503.93. Paid for teachers wages, \$9212.50; paid for fuel and school supplies, \$1291.66; paid for repairs, improving grounds and janitor, \$2016.66; paid on principal and interest on bonds and warrants, \$11,596.70; clerk's salary, \$100; paid for library books, \$233.52; for all other purposes, \$1676.73; total expenditures, \$26,127.77; cash on hand, \$375.62.


