O. A. C. HAS TAKEN MANY FROM HERE

Professor J. B. Horner Says Oregon School is Doing Share in Present Crisis.

"The World War will last for three to thirty years," said Professor J. B. Horner of the Oregon Agricultural College in a recent interview while in this city the first of the week, with a Gazette-Times representative. Professor Horner bases this statement upon facts he has learned from various sources and from the men who stand high in the military affairs of this country. It was a noticeable fact at the opening of the war that the Oregon Agricultural College students who had previous thorough military training offered their services to Uncle Sam. However the War Department through Major Bell has issued a statement to students in land grant colleges that they can best serve their government by remaining under military and industrial instruction until their services are called for. Therefore, the Oregon Agricultural College and other institutions of that type are co-operating with the government in educating young men and women to be of the greatest possible aid in the movement of food preparedness, which is to decide the war; also the institution desires to be helpful in placing Oregon boys who go to war in positions of rank where their valor and their lives will count for most.

For this purpose, the College Faculty are visiting every nook and corner of the State during their vacation to meet young men and women who need help in this national crisis. "It would be regarded as a patriotic act on the part of anyone," said Prof. Horner, "to send the College the name and address of any one who ought to make better preparation for the defense and protection of our country."

From the large number of students who have registered in the Oregon Agricultural College from Heppner and vicinity, Professor Horner recalls Harvey McAllister, who for a long time was dean of athletics for Morrow county. Then there is the Currin family which has been steadily represented at O. A. C., first by ones and then by two ever since Professor D. V. S. Reid was principal of the Heppner schools. George J. Currin attended the school in the early days and later nearly every one of his children have received their higher education there. They are, Hugh Currin, Lillie Currin, Nettie, Mabry and Mary Currin. Others are Roy Brock, Robert and Mamie Stott, Ralph I. Prominent Families Again United.

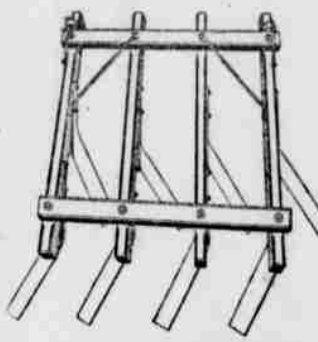
