**STATE INDUSTRIAL
NOTES OF INTEREST**

The Eugene Woolen Mills have
contracted for 25,000 yards of army
cloth.

Linn county is putting a hard top
on the road from Jefferson to Harris-
burg.

Portland is alarmed about increas-
ing shortage of fuel oil. Many con-
tracts are expiring and advancing
prices are almost prohibitive.

Silverton—A farmers wool pool of
65,000 lbs. sold for 72½ cents.

Medford—County court asks state
highway commission for \$12,000 to
help build highway to Blue Ledge
mine.

Astoria is building a public mar-
ket.

Portland shipyards employ 5200
men at good wages. So far imported
agitators have been unable to break
up the open shop system.

Salem—Work is starting on the
new Southern Pacific depot here.

Pendleton—First ten miles paved
state highway to state line, let to
Warren Bros., (bitulithic) as lowest
bidders, at \$119,120.

Salem canneries handled 35 tons of
strawberries daily last week.

Gardiner is to secure a new pas-
senger station.

Porter Bros. will move sawmill to
Coos Bay and establish a shipyard.

Echo—Two sheepmen will build
\$4000 houses near here.

Roseburg manufacturers are try-
ing to secure contract for millions of
oak tent pegs needed by the army.

The S. P. Co. has finished a mod-
ern passenger depot at Reedsburg.

Eugene—The State University has
completed military drill hall and will
start work on \$50,000 dormitory.

The increasing scarcity of labor is
alarming eastern Oregon ranchers.

Roseburg—The railroad to North
Umpqua forest will not be built.
The County voted \$300,000 aid but
promoters met too many obstacles.

Hood River apple crop for 1917
will be handled by Seattle Northwest-
ern Fruit exchange.

Pendleton must cease polluting the
Umatilla river and build a \$20,000
septic sewage tank.

Portland—E. J. Stack, Secretary
of State Federation of Labor, has re-
turned from a tour of Eastern Oregon
organizing farmers on the North Da-
kota plan.

Coos Bay—Grant Smith and E. V.
Hauser contemplate building a ship-
yard on Coos Bay. They already
have one at Vancouver, B. C., Aber-
deen, Wash., and St. Johns.

Marshfield—The construction de-
partment of the S. P. Co. has finished
a 3-years job on Coos Bay line, which
makes possible running of finest lim-
ited trains to that point.

Independence—This section work-
ing hard to get acreage sufficient to
insure building of beet sugar factory
in spring.

Portland—The Hammer Lumber
Co. plans to purchase 14,000 acres of
timber land in Clatsop county for
\$4,000,000.

The Pacific Coast Defense League
strongly urges the building of a mil-
itary road by the government from
the Canadian line to the Mexican
border.

Astoria—\$20,000 distributed last
week to loggers in wages.

Gold Hill—Beaver Cement plant
near here to start operations.

Medford—Development work in
the cinnabar district near Browns-
boro has uncovered a "soap mine."
It is a mineral soap, and it resembles
the old-fashioned, dark-yellow soap
bars that corner grocers years ago
used to display.

Huntington—What is believed to
be one of the richest gold, silver and
copper mines opened up in the United
States for 15 years is now being de-
veloped at Irondyke on the Snake.

Albany—A new cannery here is
now assured.

Roseburg—A contract for the en-
tire production of the Sunshine ranch
let to the Gile packing company. 80-
000 pounds crop is estimated.

Lakeview—W. J. Jamison's 900-
acre ranch has been sold for \$90,000.
Including 3000 head sheep, 64 head
horses and mules.

Corvallis—2 cars of wool shipped
from here brought 60 cents a pound.

Pendleton—768 acres of land near
here has sold for \$58,000.

Pilot Rock—300,000 lbs. of wool
sold here at 61 cents per pound.

Hermiston—Local railroad yards
showing much activity.

Had Big Celebration.

One of the celebrations which we

at the Harry Turner ranch on Sand
HoW. About 32 people gathered
there and spent the day in an ap-
propriate manner. Mr. and Mrs. Frank
Turner and family, Mr. and Mrs. W.

The city is having some good work
done in putting in some fine gravel
around the different crossings on
Main street. This will eliminate to
a great extent the bumps at these
street crossings.
