German Supplies Stored in This Country.
 While the United States was neutral prior to last April, German agents bought up and stored vast quantities of supplies for the purpose of depriving our allies of raw materials necessary for the conduct of the war and also secured control of several manufacturing plants for the same purpose. Stores held by Germans or for their account include a million bales of cotton and large quantities of hides, leather, oils, steel products, copper, nickel and chemicals. The total market value of these stores is probably two hundred million dollars and their withdrawal from our markets has naturally enhanced prices. Under the trading with the enemy act these stores will be seized and put to good use.—New York Commercial.
