Water Power Available.
 Among the many schemes to reduce the H. C. of L. the Pacific Northwest bids fair to do its share. In these states there are 35,000,000 horsepower in the available waterfalls and rivers of which only 1,472,000 is being developed. The power that is wasted could be utilized and would be sufficient to heat and light every building on the Pacific Slope. The development of this power would reduce the price of coal and wood, making these fuels available for other purposes. Factories could depend upon power at a very low rate, resulting in the local manufacture of products that now have to be shipped away for manufacture, and shipped back for consumption.—Scobey, Montana, Sentinel.
 All that prevents this development is failure of Congress to pass legislation under which capital can be secured for investment. Pinchot conservation policies have tied the hands of the west.—Pacific Manufacturer.
