

**"STRICTLY FRESH" EGGS  
MAY BE CHINA PRODUCT**

University of Oregon, Eugene, Nov. 26.—Are you sure that the "strictly fresh" egg you had for breakfast today did not come from China?

Compilations recently made by the University of Oregon school of commerce show that 400,000,000 fresh or preserved eggs are exported from China every year. Many of them come to America. Apparently they are disguised when they get here, as you seldom see a dealer advertising "Chinese eggs for sale."

Large quantities of dried or frozen egg products are now prepared for shipment to America every year, according to the report.

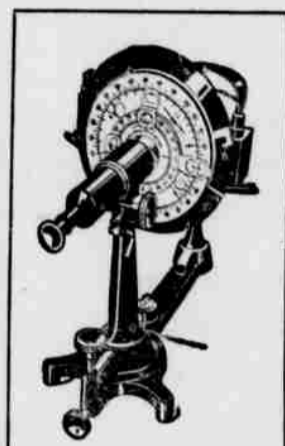
