### U. S. GUARDS WANTED FOR HOME SERVICE

There is being organized a United States Guard, National Army, whose duty will be to protect Government interests in this country. It will also be used in carrying out the provisions of the President's proclamation pertaining to alien enemies. Where practicable, men enlisted for this branch of service will be placed on duty in the vicinity of their homes. As this force is designated for immediate use and not training, men who served in the Spanish-American War, the Boxer, Philippine and Mexican border campaigns in the Army, Navy,

Marine Corps or Militia are particularly desired. The any man between the ages of 18 and 21 and 40 who can pass the required physical examination is acceptable. Pay, allowances, ratings, etc. are the same as Infantry, Regular Army. The term of enlistment is for the duration of the war. Men wishing to serve their country in a military capacity yet are reluctant to go as fighters to Europe now have an opportunity to join the United States Guards.
