Inasmuch as this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, peace and safety of the city of Heppner in this: That said diseases are so prevalent that steps must be taken immediately to control their spread, therefore, an lasting from April 1 to May 1. For emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its approval by the Mayor.
