Work Starts on McRoberts Garage.

Work was begun Tuesday on the new garage building of W. T. McRoberts on his Main street lots where the livery barn formerly stood. This building will be of concrete construction, 66x132 feet, and Mr. Lansdowne, the construction engineer in charge, states that it will be the largest single garage building in Eastern Oregon. This new structure will be a great improvement to that portion of Main street.

M. L. Case, owner of the lots just south, can not state definitely at this time just what his plans are with regard to building. He has not removed the butcher shop yet, and is undecided just what he will do with it. He had planned to move the building onto the E. M. Shutt lot just north of the Stewart barn, which property he recently purchased for that purpose, but the City Council has put a quietus on this by extending the fire limits to include the sixth half of that block. Mr. Case is convinced that he has been having one deal of a time getting his property fixed up, so he is just now somewhat up in the air as to his building operations.

Another Building on South Willow.
Another big building for south Willow street will be begun right away, the material for which has been ordered. It is to be of concrete construction, 46x80, and C. A. Lansdowne, builder, will soon be ready to start operations. He is now finishing up, as rapidly as possible the new Hill and Johns garage, being busy this week putting in the concrete floor. These gentlemen will then move out of the building now occupied by them in the rear of the Masonic building, when ground will be cleared for the new structure to occupy the east side of their property.

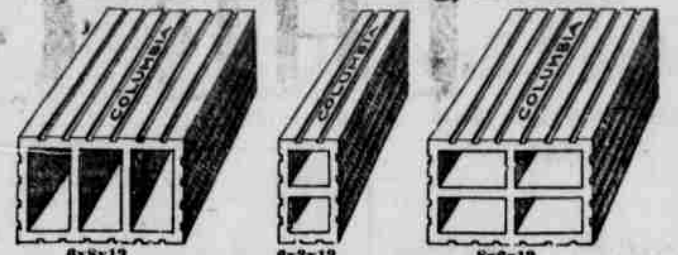
Teachers' Institute.
