**SCIENCE ADDS PROFITS TO DAIRYMAN'S EFFORTS**

Linn County Operator Reports Gain Of \$45 on Monthly Pay-Check From Same Number Cows.

Oregon Agricultural College, Corvallis, March 18.—Dairymen are entitled to a fair profit on their investment and labor, but it is not fair to consumers of dairy products to be taxed for wasteful production, comments the Oregonian. Dairymen are today testifying to the value of scientific methods of production in cheapening the cost.

"In two years' time my cream check has increased from \$142 to \$187 a month from the same number of cows," writes a Linn county member of the testing association. "My cows increased in milk yield 30 percent as a result of improved rations," and "When fed your rations, cows yielding 32 pounds of milk increased to 42 pounds," are other reports of Oregon dairymen.

Feeding, breeding, record-keeping, silos, and testing, marketing and bull associations, are some of the cost-production factors placed on a scientific basis by dairymen cooperating with the federal department of agriculture of the state agricultural college.

Some of the things done are sending 164 slacker cows to the butcher, buying 11 pure-bred bulls for association members, erecting 41 silos, purchasing 24 ear loads of dairy feeds, organizing three new testing associations, purchasing 74 pure-bred dairy cattle for association members, and checking 31 separators.

Dairymen who were operating at a loss may turn it into profit by improving one or more of these factors.
