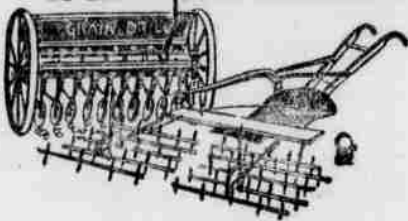

Walla Walla Ready for Show.
Walla Walla business men have made great preparations for the coming demonstration. The 600-acre Yeasley farm near the city has been secured for the various tests and many kinds of tractors will be given practical tests for the benefit of the farmers. Transportation to and from the farm is simple and arrangements have been made to handle the crowds. Already exhibits from Eastern farms have reached Walla Walla.

In a message sent out to exhibitors urging them to make the display as complete as possible A. S. Fetterman, secretary of the Pacific Northwest Tractor and Power Farming Association says:

"It must be remembered that a survey of the obligation laid upon the United States as a direct result of its enlarged position as a world power renders it certain that power farming machinery will immediately assume an important place in our industrial and agricultural development. Agriculture stands out today as the leader in the world's pursuits. The necessity of increased production of crops with a decrease in man power, during the period of the great world war, directed attention to the economies of power farming, with the result that animal power is more rapidly giving place to mechanical power than is generally realized by those who have not made a study in the changed condition on the farms of the nation.

"Profitable cultivation of farm land demands that every convenience be at hand for taking advantage of natural conditions and conserving manual labor. This enables the farmer to plant more acres and plant them well thus resulting in larger and first class crops.

"The Walla Walla tractor show is for the sole purpose of showing the farmer what power farming will accomplish. The machinery to be displayed will be put under every conceivable test so the farmer may see at a glance just what he may expect in improvement of his own conditions by the use of power machinery."

School Children to Write Essays.

Portland, Ore., April 15.—Essays by the school children of Oregon on the subject "Why a Victory Loan" should all be in the hands of the committee on or before April 16. The essays are being prepared by the children under the direction of the teachers in the grades and are transmitted through the school superintendents. The ten best essays from each county are entered in the statewide competition. The judges who will award the prizes in the essay contest are the following Portland educators: D. A. Grout, T. T. Davis, Lincoln High School; H. H. Herdman, Washington School; S. F. Ball, Franklin High School; C. E. Cleveland, Benson Polytechnic; Annie E. Arnold, Girls Polytechnic; Hopkins Jenkins, Jefferson High School; W. T. Fletcher, James-Johns, and E. R. Scroul, High School of Commerce.
