**CHAMBERLAIN ATTACKS INJUSTICE OF BAKER**

Cites New Cases of Brutal Inhumanity in Imposing Sentences Upon Soldiers.

Washington, April 30.—Further exhortation of Secretary of War Baker for upholding the system of military injustice during his administration has been voiced by Senator Chamberlain, of Oregon, Democratic chairman of the Senate Committee on Military Affairs during the war, and his statement is accompanied by facts.

"We owe it to our American soldiers who have fought this fight," said he, "to see to it that justice and not injustice is meted out to them by the authorities in Washington, and with God's help I shall continue to do what I can to see to it that justice is done them. It is certainly not pleasant to criticize, but when we entered this war I forgot that I was a Democrat and remembered only that I was an American. I have, when I saw a wrong done, pointed out that wrong, and I shall continue to do so as long as wrongs are persisted in. This matter of military injustice is not a personal controversy between the Secretary of War and myself, and it should not be a matter of controversy between Col. Ansell and Gen. Crowder.

"Let me tell you what it is about. In substance the articles of war provide that the Judge Advocate General shall have the power to modify or revise the findings of courts-martial. It is my view and that of Col. Ansell that this is the purport of the regulations. On the other hand, the view of Mr. Baker and Gen. Crowder is that they have no power to do what the law expressly gives them power to do. This is a strange construction of the law. In civil life law is a law, but in military life some people seem to think it just the other way.

"There are men in our army who look upon an enlisted man as a mere piece of flesh, and not as a human being with feelings and with rights that should be protected. This moment I have in mind the cases of two boys who were absent without leave for five days, and one of them was given fifteen years and the other twenty-five years by the court that had tried them. A poor boy in San Francisco volunteered, was absent a few hours, was given five years, escaped, was recaptured and then was given ten years. The American people are not going to permit the American army to be Prussianized in any such way as this. The letters that are coming to me are heart-rending, and I shall place in the record not two or three, but a thousand cases which will shock Congress into taking proper action."

**EASTERN AND WESTERN OREGON JOIN IN PROMOTING TWO NEW PROJECTS**

Two sections of Oregon that are separated by a great distance geographically on account of two barrier mountain ranges are figuratively joining hands for a united drive on the ballot boxes at the special state election in June. That great stretch of empire known as Eastern Oregon is enthusiastically working to give the coast counties of Oregon the Roosevelt highway; the seven great coast counties comprising one-seventh of the area if the state are just as enthusiastically working to develop the irrigation projects of the East Oregonians.

An apt illustration of the friendly spirit that is animating the coast counties is a rally held at Gardiner on the Umpqua river recently when settlers came by the hundreds to boost for the Roosevelt highway bond issue. Some of those in attendance came from points miles distant in boats. More than a thousand gathered at Gardiner to hear President S. C. Pier of the Roosevelt Highway Association explain the wonderful possibilities that will be opened up by what he declared will be the greatest scenic boulevard in the world.

The assemblage not only endorsed the highway project, but it went on record with a unanimous resolution favoring the passage of the Gallagher bill whereby the State is given authority to lend its credit to irrigation projects approved by a special commission consisting of the state superintendent of banks, the state engineer and the attorney general.

Letters and telegrams endorsing the Gallagher bill are pouring into the headquarters of the Roosevelt Highway Association at the Imperial Hotel from the chambers of commerce and other public-spirited organizations all over the coast. Similar endorsements for the coast highway are reaching the association by the score from the irrigation belts of eastern, southern and central Oregon.

The two bills are of kindred importance. The Roosevelt Highway if built will bring millions of tourists to Oregon. These tourists will not only view the unparalleled scenery offered by the highway, but they will seek opportunities to invest their money and make their homes in Oregon. The great stretches of land in the irrigation sections offer the best kind of chance for investments. The people of Eastern Oregon and other sections that are looking to their future development through irrigation are only too well aware that anything they do to insure the construction of the coast highway will be therefore to their own interest. For this reason they have been glad to get behind the highway movement.

**Paved With Fool's Gold.**  
No, the rock that is being used to grade the streets of Canyon City is not high grade gold ore, although it has much of the appearance of the precious metal. It is fool's gold, or iron pyrites and to the uninitiated it has a close resemblance. This rock is a sort of a cross between a slate and a serpentine and is being used to grade the streets. It is being quarried just at the outskirts of town and at a place which is known locally as Hog Flat, and here it was that gold was first found on Canyon creek. It is said that this ground paid as high as \$300 a day to the man. It was a rich point, and when the rock was being hauled into town and all streaked up with what was apparently gold it had the suggestion of the new Jerusalem, but all that glitters is not gold, and the streets of Canyon are only being paved with fool's gold and not the real thing as it might appear. Canyon City is buying Liberty Bonds with its gold and not paving the streets with it.—Blue Mountain Eagle.
