RABBITS INJURING ECHO SHEEP RANGE

Rabbits are destroying the sheep range south of Echo to such an extent that the sheepmen are interested in the poisoning of the pests and have offered to co-operate with the farmers, according to Fred Bennion, county agent, and D. L. Jamison of the U. S. Biological Survey, who returned from a survey of the west end of the county.

The survey, which was made for the purpose of investigating conditions before the winter poisoning campaign, revealed also that the rabbits are especially thick on the alfalfa farms on Butter creek.

Another serious phase of the situation, says Mr. Bennion, toward which the energies of the coming extermination campaign will be directed, is the great number of rabbits in the inside territory, which is covered with sage brush and which while not farming territory, forms a reeding place for the rabbits.

Sentiment in the west end is strong in favor of the poisoning, according to Mr. Bennion, and the farmers seem eager to cooperate. Estimates of the poison necessary for the work will be made and the campaign organized for the winter work.

Mr. Bennion and Mr. Jamison will visit Pilot Rock and Nolin to continue investigations.—Pendleton E. O.
