American Manufacturers Desire the Metric System

San Francisco, Nov. 24 .- It is the opinion of the manufacturers of the state of Washington that metric units of measurement should be used in the United States. A referendum vote just conducted by the Manufacturers' Association of Seattle showed 2 to 1 majority in favor of meterliter-gram, the metric standards.

Following is a copy of the resolution sent by them to President Wilson: "In order that you may have knowledge of the interest taken by the manufacturers of Washington and sentiment with reference to changes which should be made in our system of weights and measures, we advise you that the result of a referendum taken among the manufacturers of this state shows that they are 2 to 1 in favor of the adoption of the meter-liter-gram or metric system."

"We believe that this system will eventually become the standard the world over and hope that you wi use your good offices to establish it at the earliest possible time in th United States .- Manufactureres' As sociation of Washington."

This resolution is typical of those which are being received daily at Washington, D. C. from engineers, manufacturers, and men of every profession all over theUnited States.



Encourage Increased Salmon Production

The salmon pack this year has been somewhat lighter than usual. It is alleged that the streams of the Pacific Coast and Alaska are being over-fished. The Federal government is studying the situation to dotermine, if possible, the reasons for this year's lessened pack. The gov ernment is considering the propogation of a largely increased number of salmon fry as an insurance against the depletion of the commercial supply in the future. It is understood that the number of hatcheries will be increased and that more efficient methods will be introduced.

Pacific coast states should exert themselves to increase salmon propogation in every stream flowing into the Pacific. The small amount ex pended on fish hatcheries is returned an hundred fold in the way of in creased development of the salmon packing industry, employment of labor and taxes paid.

Soldiers Want Beekeeping.

Disabled soldiers in large numbers are asking for a course in beekeeping that will enable them to take it up as a vocation. In response the department of enthology at the O. A. C. experiment station will give an intensive course of two hours-each fore noon and afternoon of Farmers week December 29-Jaunary 3. Many fruit men also ask for the course to assist them in putting aplaries in their orchards for pollination. Honey producers want to join the class to increase honey production in these days of scarce sugar and high sugar substitute prices. "Enough practice will be given the students to enable them to overcome the initial besitancy in handling bees," says Prof. A. L. Lovett, who will have charge of the course.
