University Will Erect Tablet to Honor First President

University of Oregon Eugene, Nov. 24, 1919.—A bronze tablet in memory of John Wesley Johnson, first president of the University of Oregon, is soon to be placed in the corridor of the administration building, named Johnson Hall in his honor. The building was named when dedicated four years ago, but no memorial tablet has yet been placed. The tablet, just received from a Portland brass works, is inscribed as follows:

"John Wesley Johnson, the first president of the University of Oregon, was born near Kansas City, Missouri, in the year 1836. In 1876 he was appointed to the presidency of the University of Oregon. He served the

shovel is progressing at the rate of 4100 feet a month, working only one shift. In the spring two shifts will be added and work will continue day and night during the summer.

Between twelve and thirteen hundred feet of the tunnel bore is completed and work is proceeding rapidly from both ends of the big job. Next summer and fall the distribution system on the Teel lands will be put in and ready for the water by the time the tunnel is completed.

One outstanding feature of this distribution system is the fact that there is not a foot of flume to be built on the whole 16,500 acres. Very few irrigation projects are this fortunate. The contour of the lands lends itself to broader system of irrigation and it is likely that very little of the district land will be irrigated by the flood system that prevails in the Meadows district.—Echo News.

Fattest Boy

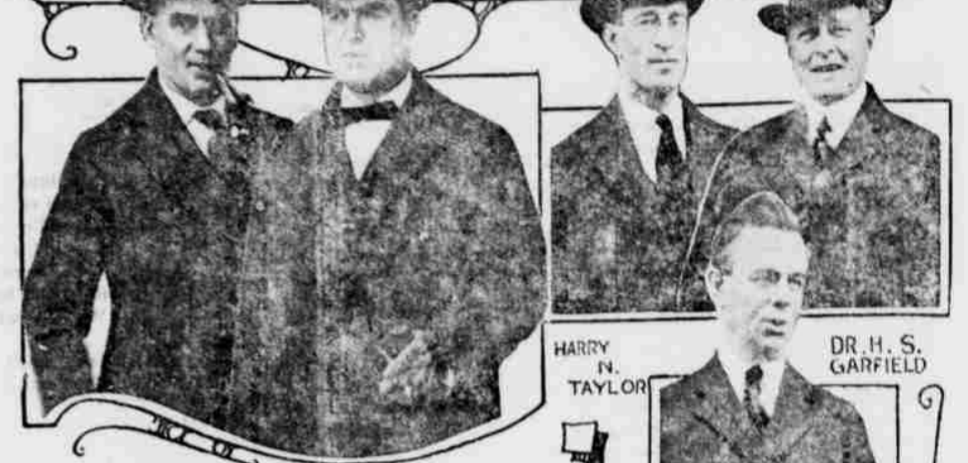
