This road runs up Rhea creek from Jordan Siding and is a distinct asset to Ione. More than that it will work to the benefit of the entire county. It is only a beginning in what is planned for the ultimate in Morrow county's road

construction campaign So far as the roads in the outlying districts are concerned, and they are of vital importance to the successful growth and development of the county, their condition will be but temporarily improved until such a time as the county is financially able to construct permanent roads.

We are confident that when the Independent has collected it's data concerning the claims which have been made against the court, it will be found that there has been no discrimination and that the court has done all within it's means to give everything possible to all parts of the county without fear or favor.

Value of the Dollar

A dollar is worth what it will buy exactly that and no more. It is a standard of value, but a fluctuating and relative standard. Money is a medium of barter. When commodities increase in price, it simply means that the purchasing power of the dollar has decreased. When the ware-earner receives more for his labor, the clothier receives more for his goods, the farmer receives more for his product, and the manufacturor receives more for his manufactures. Neither the intrinsic value of labor nor of any commodity can be artificially changed. They maintain their relative values. If we give more dollars for one, we must give more dollars for the other. If the wageearner in 1914 received \$3.00 per day, which would purchase sixty pounds of sugar, and if today the wage-earner is paid \$6.00, and this sum will buy only sixty pounds of sugar, the relative values remain un-




