STATE NEWS

O. & C. Land Grant Open to Entry.
 Secretary of the Interior Lane has ordered the opening of the land which was formerly embraced in the O. & C. railroad grant. The territory is mostly within the Roseburg district. Opening of the land was deferred pending the enactment of legislation by congress granting a preference right of entry to soldiers, sailors and marines of the late war. The world war veterans will have preference right to make homestead entry. The period of the preference right begins May 10 and ends July 8.

Road Work Starts.
 Otis Mascal and Boyd Erikson of Dayville were in Canyon Monday and stated that work on the John Day Highway was progressing rapidly. At the unit in the gorge about six miles below Dayville there is a big crew of men at work. They expect to work about 80 men here. They have the steam shovel, which was on the highway between Prairie and John Day on this unit and working on the old Putman grade, lowering it some 12 feet. In the vicinity of Spray they say that there are about 200 men on highway work.—Canyon City Eagle.

Issue Was Illegal.
 A bond issue of \$1000 voted by the taxpayers of school district No. 43, in Grant county was held to be irregular by the attorney-general because the minutes of the meeting of the board of directors failed to show that the election on issuance of the securities was authorized in compliance with the state laws. The opinion was requested by O. P. Hoff, state treasurer.—Canyon City Eagle.

Thinking of Paving Work.

The force of the Warren Construction company is getting ready to resume work on its street paving contract in Enterprise. Supt. P. F. Creamer has had considerable work done at J. A. Eggleston's gravel pit so that material can be got out more easily. Street work cannot be begun safely until the frost is out of the ground and reasonably settled spring weather has come. The company has surfaced nine of the 20 blocks in its 1919 contract.—Enterprise Record-Chief.

Reith Will Be Passenger Division.

With the return of the O. W. R. & N. road to private control Reith, which has been a freight division point since the war, will become a passenger division. Four of the thru trains will change engine crews there instead of at Umatilla, as at present. A mile of new siding is being laid at Reith in preparation for handling increased freight business. Reith is situated just below Pendleton.

James Noregaard got the decision over Ted Thye in the handicap wrestling match at Wallowa Saturday night. Thye was to throw the Wallowa county man twice in two hours, but failed to get him down once. Noregaard naturally worked on the defensive thruout. The bout was held before a large crowd in McLean's theater.—Enterprise Record-Chief.
