The Republican National Committee has created a Woman's Division of that organization, with Mrs. John Glover South, of Kentucky, at its head. She succeeds Mrs. Medill McCormick, who was unable to serve actively because of ill health. Mrs. South is a daughter of the late Governor and Senator, W. O. Bradley. She has been active in the suffrage movement and is well known throughout the country. The Woman's Division has three Vice Chairmen, Miss Mary Garrett Hay, of New York; Mrs. Margaret Hill McCarter, of Kansas, and Mrs. Josephine Corliss Preston, Washington state. An executive committee of ten was also created as follows: Miss Hay, chairman; Mrs. Thomas H. Carter, Montana; Mrs. McCarter; Mrs. Preston; Mrs. Florence Collins Porter, California; Mrs. Raymond Robins, Illinois; Mrs. South; Mrs. Maudie Williams, Rhode Island; Mrs. Eliza M. West, Utah.

S. ARMY WILL SPEND BUDGET IN OREGON

An analysis of the \$284,000 budget to be raised in Oregon Rescue Week, May 1 to 10 to provide for the work laid out by the advisory boards in convention in Portland, March 17, shows that every dollar of the fund is to be spent in Oregon in one or the other of the seventeen activities that mark the service given by the army to the state.

Following the war the demands for service coming into the Salvation Army headquarters, forced the expansion of its efforts in the field and made it imperative that the army reach beyond the confines of the city and attend to the pressing needs of communities in remote sections of the state. Its equipment was found woefully inadequate by the state advisory board and after the reports of the county boards had been received and studied, it was found necessary to authorize several large property deals to assure the lasses that they would have the institutions and homes that would permit them to carry on their labor of sacrifice and love.

For the purchase of the White Shield home as the Oregon Salvation Army rescue and maternity home the budget provides \$75,000 and for the operation and maintenance of the home which annually cares for approximately 200 girl mothers from all corners of the state, \$9,500 is provided.

For the purchase of the Bishop Scott school in Yamhill county and for fitting it up and opening it as a boys and girls industrial and agricultural school, home and farm for the neglected kiddies of Oregon, \$40,000 is provided.

To carry on the prison work, the watching over destitute families left without a provider when the father is sent to the prison cell and the work of finding employment for and rehabilitating discharged prisoners, \$1,200 is provided.

For annual Corps Budget and operating expenses and for increasing Salvation Army work in the virgin territory of the smaller communities of the state, the largest part of the Home Service Program for 1920, \$40,000 is provided.

A Salvation Army relief fund for the poor families in the state of Oregon and a fund for special emergencies of \$6,000 is provided.

A central building to cost \$90,000 and to be built upon the site now owned by the Salvation Army at Sixth and Ankeny street, Portland, will house the industrial home for the rehabilitation of men and women
