Bordeaux Spray Good for Late Potato Blight.

Oregon Agricultural College, Corvallis, April 21.—For late potato blight spray with Bordeaux mixture, suggests H. P. Bars, plant pathologist of the O. A. C. experiment station. This disease attacks the plants in most sections comparatively late in the season.

"The fungus, which has a whitish misty appearance, attacks the leaves and in some cases kills even the stalks," says Professor Bars. "It thrives in cool and showery weather and is more readily found where the foliage is heaviest. A crop stricken with the disease looks like a field destroyed by frost."

Although this blight is serious, it may in some years cause thousands of dollars worth of damage to the potato crop, being most destructive in the sections along the Columbia river west of the Cascades."

Right Rations Aid Egg Yield.

A ration for laying hens that provides balance of feed elements at economical costs under present conditions consists of the following, reports Prof. James Dryden, chief of poultry at O. A. C.: Wheat, 25 pounds; oats, 15; mill run, 20; ground oats or barley, 5; linseed oil meal, 5; meat or fresh scrap, 7; kale or other greens, 45; bone, 2; grit, 3; shell, 2; charcoal, 2. The meat scrap may be displaced with 50 pounds of buttermilk or skim milk.
