When the supreme court ruled that Olcott was governor in fact and elected to serve the full unexpired term of Withycombe, he announced he would appoint the republican nominee at the primaries as secretary of state, relinquishing the office by which he stepped up to the governorship.

April Exports, Imports Increase.

A drop of \$135,000,000 in exports and of nearly \$30,000,000 in imports in April as compared with the preceding month of March is shown by the total-value statement issued by the Bureau of Foreign and Domestic Commerce, of the Department of Commerce.

Exports in April were valued at \$684,000,000, against \$820,000,000

in March of this year and \$715,000,000 in April of last year. For the 10-months period ending with April, exports amounted to \$6,734,000,000 this year, an increase of \$1,034,000,000 over the amount of \$5,700,000,000 in the same period of the fiscal year 1919.

Imports in April amounted to \$495,000,000, against \$524,000,000

in March of this year and \$237,000,000 in April of last year. During the 10-months period ending with April, imports were \$4,254,000,000, an increase of \$1,780,000,000 over the amount of \$2,474,000,000 in the 10-months period of 1919.

Imports of gold during April formed the largest monthly total for several years amounting to \$50,000,000, against \$17,000,000 in March and \$7,000,000 in April a year ago. During the 10-months period of the fiscal year, imports of gold were \$110,000,000, against \$35,000,000 in 1919. Exports of gold during April were \$44,000,000, approximately the same as for previous months of this year, compared with exports of less than \$2,000,000 in April of 1919. In the 10-months period, exports of gold amounted to \$452,000,000, against \$32,000,000 in the same period a year ago.

Republican Convention Now Near at Hand

Practically all of the delegates to the Republican National Convention, which meets at Chicago on June 8, have now been chosen. The preliminary contests, as between candidates for the nomination, have been marked by a keen rivalry and a tense spirit born of the general feeling that an overwhelming victory is surely forthcoming in November. Popular pre-convention interest is aroused to an extraordinary degree and undoubtedly the gathering at Chicago will be the greatest in the party's history.

Uncertainty attaches to the nominations two weeks before the date fixed. Primaries have not clearly pointed to the identity of the standard-bearer. It is evidently to be an open-ended convention—in the sense that a large percentage of the delegates will be unattached or uncommitted when they take their seats and open to conviction as to choice.

With few exceptions, the primaries have not been altogether illuminating in results. Experience in the preliminary campaign has demonstrated, in the opinion of close students of the political conditions, the need of a uniform primary system and a movement toward that end doubtless will follow this quadrennial struggle.

The number of contested delegations, almost wholly from the south, promises to be much smaller than in former years. On May 31 the national committee will meet at the Coliseum, Chicago, to take up these contests for presentation to the committee on credentials of the convention.

All the detailed arrangements for the convention, under the direction of Committeeman A. T. Hart, chairman, are well in hand.

Throughout the country the prevailing sentiment is that this is a Republican year and that the era of incompetence, inefficiency and colossal waste, so demoralizing to the public welfare of the nation, will be brought to an end on March 4, 1921.
