How to Clean Seed Grain

We realize of course that these lines which follow will not apply to Farm Bureau members in Morrow county, because every Farm Bureau member in Morrow county already cleans his seed in such a way that he gets the very biggest crops. However, there are a few in the county who raise grain and who are not Farm Bureau members, and we ask that you who will have the privilege of reading this will talk the matter over with your less fortunate neighbors and encourage them to sow good seed. We have talked with a number of farmers over the four counties which border on the Columbia river, during the summer, and we find that the best farmers, without exception, make a practice of culling their seed very close so as to sow only the very choicest seed. Tom Boylen, who has a large ranch on Butter creek, discounts nearly fifty per cent of his seed grain, sowing only the very largest and best kernels. Many farmers in Sherman county discount as much as thirty-three and one-third per cent. We know of a number of men last year who did not clean their grain at all and took it just as it came from the threshing machine and sowed it on the land. We know others

who run it through such a course sieve that all they took out was just the longest straws so that it didn't interfere with their drill. I am sure that there is not a man who will not, when he stops to think, admit that it will be good business to plant only the strongest kernels. Strong kernels come through the ground much more readily. When you are raising hogs and raising cattle you use this method. Think it over. Somewhere between twenty and fifty per cent is probably the right amount of seed to sow. At least be sure that you use every diligence to plant only the vigorous seed.

Heading and Threshing

Morrow county stands by itself in the methods of harvesting pursued. Sherman county, Gilliam county, and Umatilla county practically entirely, harvest their grain by the combine method. A large per cent of Morrow county farmers harvest by using two or more headers to cut the grain and then haul it to the thresher to thresh it. This is giving excellent satisfaction. It seems that grain cut in this way is really worth more than when cut with the combine as it eliminates the necessity of bulking the grain in

the fields as well as the hauling of the straw, which is no small item. Early rains tend to damage straw left in the fields, the sun tends to bleach it, and much valuable feed is lost. In a county such as Morrow where winter feed for livestock is scarce and much stock is to be fed, it would seem that the stacking of straw is a valuable item and of vital consideration in farm economics.
