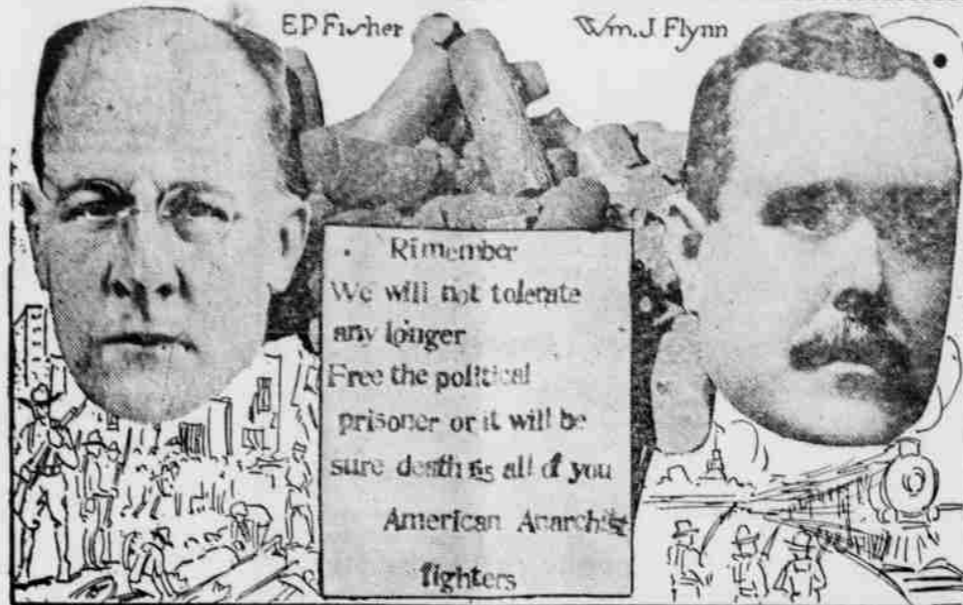

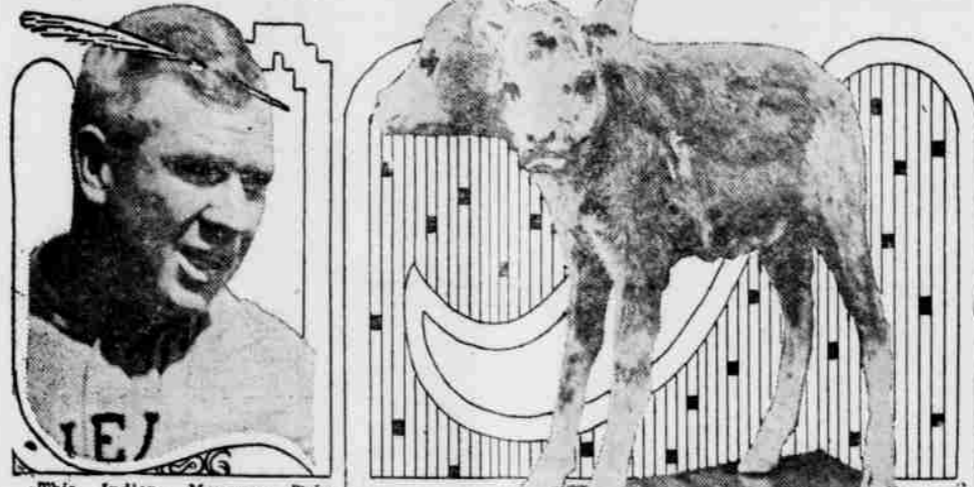
Drastic Action Marks Search for Bomb Plot Guilty

Shortly after the Wall Street disaster Thursday messages were being flashed all over the country. Detective agencies were hot on trails, soldiers were being rushed to establish guard at all important federal points. One of the most important clues that resulted in the arrest of E. P. Fischer (above at left), was based upon the fact that warnings of the impending disaster had been written by Fischer to a number of his friends. He says that his knowledge of the affair was through telepathy only. His sanity is questioned. Wm. J. Flynn, chief of the secret service of the U. S., was sent from Washington on a special train and given the right of way. Here is a pile of shrapnel in the form of window weights that perforated everything from stone walls to human beings and horses. This Gets the Weeds. Disking the winter grain field as soon as dry enough will kill the young weeds newly up and start the germination of the weed seed a little lower down. The new weed crop can then be killed by harrowing, leaving the seed bed in fine condition for a crop free of weeds.—O. A. C. Farm Crops.

College Plant Grows. New buildings and repairs completed or put under way at O. A. C. since commencement last spring cost nearly three-quarters of a million dollars, President W. J. Kerr told the students at first convocation. Within the same time 32 new members have been added to the faculty, and \$120,000 worth of equipment has been installed. The entire plant is in far better condition than ever before to care for its students, even though present registration indicates that attendance will reach 3500 this year.

Weak Colonies Unprofitable. "Weak colonies are not worth wintering," says H. A. Scullen, bee specialist at O. A. C. "It not diseased it is better to give bees and honey to a new colony. Kill the inferior queen and unite the colonies by placing the weak one on a normal one with just one thickness of newspaper between. In opening hives to find the cause of weak colonies be careful not to start robbing by leaving combs of honey exposed."
