The Oil Nation.

Due to new processes of extracting kerosene from crude oil, the increased recovery of gasoline in 1919 was 25.6 as compared with 12.8 in 1914. From 1914 to 1919 crude oil production increased 42 per cent, gasoline increased 196 per cent and automobiles increased 336 per cent.

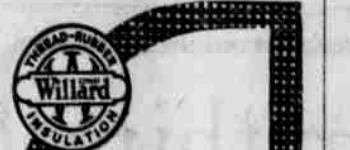
BILLIONS ARE WASTED
