FOUR YEARS A HUBBY



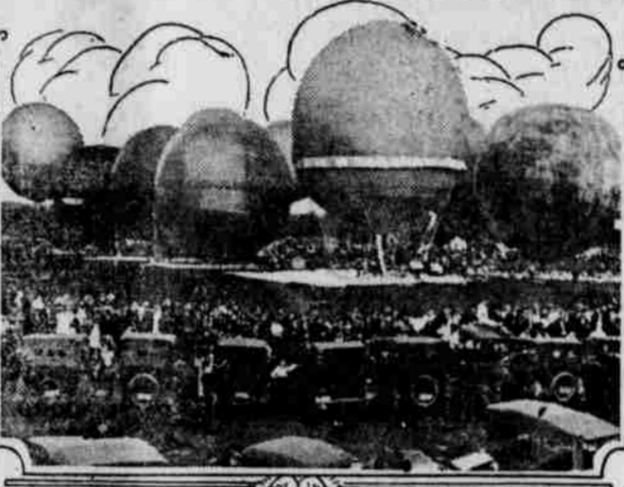
