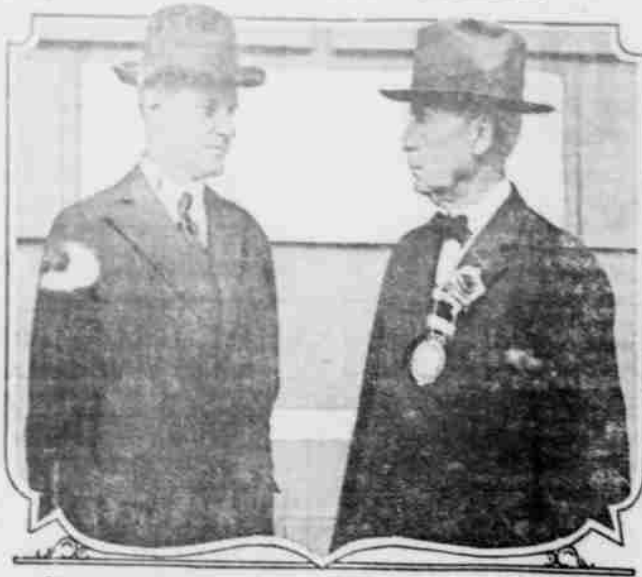

Portland, Ore.—Everything is now in readiness for commencement of work on the proposed 100-ton factory of the recently incorporated Vegetable Oil Mills company.
