

**Oregon T. B. Association Is Organizing Forces for Drive**  
 The Oregon Tuberculosis Association, under the direction of the executive secretary, Mrs. Sadie Orr-Dunbar, is organizing its forces throughout the state for the annual sale of Christmas Seals. Robert W. Osborn, who has just conducted a tuberculosis survey of eastern Oregon, has been named seal sale director and is already in the field building up an organization for what the Association hopes will be the biggest and most successful sale yet held in the state.  
 The Public Health Association will conduct the sale in the eleven counties where they exist; they are Jackson, Coos, Lane, Washington, Clackamas, Hood River, Union, Harney, Curry, Multnomah. In other counties other organizations have already signified their intention of taking an active part in the sale of the Seals. In Yamhill county club women will conduct the sale in McMinnville, Newberg, Sheridan, Willamina, Dayton, Carlton and Dundee.  
 Miss Edith Wylie of Dayville, Grant county, has the distinction of being the first woman to volunteer her services as seal sale agent before the sale has begun. Columbia and Clatsop counties were visited during the past week by Mr. Osborn and organized assistance was arranged. Mrs. Dunbar visited

sought. This means a sale of five seals per capita if the work of the Association is to be continued along its established lines. If a sum less than this is raised it will mean the sacrificing of some part of the vital educational, demonstration and experimental work. Four and a half million seals have been received by the Oregon Association. The 1930 Seal features a tiny green elf, who carries aloft the standard of the Anti-Tuberculosis Association, the red double-barred cross, while riding atop the pack of gifts carried by Santa Claus. The scheme of the stamp is to typify the "greatest gift of all, good health," and the attaching of stamps to all letters and Christmas packages during the month of December will insure the carrying of the gift of good health to hundreds of Oregon victims of this dread disease, as 95 per cent of the entire proceeds from this sale will be kept in this state to combat the disease.


