Eugene.—Inspection of plants in the east for making milk powder has convinced officials of the Eugene Farmers' Creamery association that the establishment of one here is desirable. The plan will be definitely acted on at the annual meeting.

Ashland.—Merchants and farmers participated in the Ashland Winter Fair and Southern Oregon Poultry show, which opened December 2 under the auspices of the chamber of commerce. Every kind of vegetable grown in the Rogue River valley was entered in the lists and many products manufactured locally were on display.

Halfway.—Despite high wages and low prices for gold, the Cornucopia Mines company is spending a quarter of a million dollars on development work. Long tunnels are being driven to tap lodes higher up on the mountain and a rich ore ledge, gold bearing, has been struck. The Queen mill, operated by the Gold Reef Mining company, also at Cornucopia, is operating one shift a day now and will soon be running at night also. This is the first time the company has ever made plans to run during the winter months.

News About Oregon's Industries

Portland.—A photograph with an unusually sweet tone has just been prepared by the E. F. Haskell of Haskell & Co and the work of manufacturing the instruments on a small scale has been started. The special feature of this machine is a wooden horn about five feet long, concealed in the interior of the cabinet and curving so that it gradually expands to the "bell." This stimulates any metallic sound, as the main part is of spruce. The cabinets are in period design. The manufacturing plant, it is hoped, will be expanded in the near future.

The Dalles.—Concrete brick and tiles are to be turned out of a factory, it is planned to open here shortly and which will be known as The Dalles Shupe

Pressed Brick Co. The output will be particularly designed for material for residences and public buildings.

Tillamook.—According to a report issued by the secretary of the Tillamook Creamery association, the cheese situation in this county is better than any other agricultural line in the nation. More than 90 percent of the season's cheese have already been sold. It is estimated that the price will run 15 percent higher this year than that of the New York cheese.

Oregon City.—Four hundred thousand tons of silica from the Silica King Mining company deposit have been sold to a California corporation on a royalty basis of 11 per cent. The entire deposit is estimated at over half a million tons. The California firm is to put a plant in here to handle the product and will turn out 100 tons of refined silica daily, employing at the start 24 men. The present plant has a capacity of but 25

tons a day. Sales are to be handled through the Silica Products company of Portland, to be incorporated by the California people, who are already engaged in dehydrating work in the west.

Portland.—With the enlargement of the Duxbury Aircraft company's school there will be available space and equipment so that students, if they wish to do so, may make their own airplanes while taking the courses offered. In addition there will be sales and display rooms for the use of the manufacturers. These will be housed in a two story structure having 12,000 feet of floor space, soon to be built.

Independence.—The huge hop crop from the Wigrich yard here has been sold in England and the last of it is now being sent out. The crop showed considerable increase over that of last year.
