Children at the Bread Kitchens



Three and a half million children in eastern and central Europe wait, gaunt and pinched like these, at the American kitchens for the hot soup and bread that mean life to them. In the winters since the Armistice, America has been the one friend that had food to give them. It is a common sight in Europe today to see a child five or six years old whose head has not heated. With a healthy well fed baby the skull should close before two years. America must see these children through the rigors of another winter, and to that end eight great relief organizations have combined into the European Relief Council. They seek to raise \$33,000,000 to save this generation of Europe from death by starvation and the diseases that come with under-feeding.

Would Check Strawberry Weevil.

To establish the limits of strawberry weevil infestation and release plants for shipment from weevil-free districts R. H. Fulton, specialist in entomology at the U. S. C. experiment station, has been detailed to make a complete field survey of the situation. The presence of this weevil in some parts of Oregon has resulted in the placing of a quarantine against strawberry plants from northern Oregon. Oregon growers likewise should guard against the introduction of this serious strawberry pest into uninfested areas, says A. L. Lovett, station entomologist. Care in purchasing plants, insuring that they be from weevil-free territory, is said by Professor

Clover Seed in February.

Clover in western Oregon is best seeded in late February on land that was seeded to fall grain or in some cases fall vetch. Seed is broadcasted and if the ground is dry enough harrowed in. Freezing, thawing, and rains will usually cover it deep enough. The clover should be planted when prospects for early germination and growth are favorable, that the nurse crop may not get too much the start of it. A light application of land plaster is often helpful in getting a better stand. A. W. bulletin of Soiling Crops for Western Oregon gives information on the best soiling crops. Copies free.

Farm and Home Pointers.

Spreaders for improving the covering and sticking power of spray solutions are caseinate, glue, kelinite, soap bark and oil emulsion, named in order of their efficiency and cost of preparation. It's an Uphill Pull for Polish Boys



Bare feet and tattered clothes, little to eat and less to wear, such is the fate of thousands of children in central and eastern Europe. These boys in Poland are only a sample of the 3,500,000 destitute youngsters that the European Relief Council plans to help through the cold days of the coming winter. To that end eight great organizations in America have merged to form the Council, the chairman of which is Herbert Hoover. Under his leadership the American Relief Administration, the American Red Cross, the American Friends' Service Committee (Quakers), the Federal Council of the Churches of Christ in America, the Jewish Joint Distribution Committee, the Knights of Columbus, the Y. M. C. A. and the Y. W. C. A. have decided to co-operate jointly to raise \$33,000,000 to help the European children over the hill.

The finished lamb in practically all cases must be sold at more per hundred weight than was paid for him as a feeder in order to pay out. He will do this if the market is steady because of his higher dressing percentage and better quality of mutton.—Animal Husbandry, O. A. C.

Cooperative creameries have in the majority of cases been successful in Oregon. Such failures as occurred were caused by small volume of business, poor management, severe competition, poor accounting, lack of loyalty

to patrons, lack of capital and the extension of too much credit.—Bureau of Markets, O. A. C.

About 75 per cent of a laying hen's feed is required for body maintenance. To lay well she must have a surplus of necessary food elements to manufacture eggs. Sparring feed is an expensive use of it, so it allows too little for profitable egg production.—Poultry, O. A. C.

The best food to build bones and muscles is milk, which also protects children from disease. A quart a day should be supplied each child, a little each meal as a beverage—slightly warmed for young children—and with cereals, oat or toast.—Home Economics, O. A. C.
