Lower Taxes Are Promised As The Result of Economy
Chairman Good Favors Cutting Surplus Excess Which Is Passed to the Consumer.
Washington, February 28.—As the result of saving several billions of dollars by appropriating that much less than the amounts requested by the Wilson administration during the past two days, the Republican leaders in Congress are now seeking to find a way to reduce taxation and further reduce the cost of living.
Already, as the result of this policy of the most stringent economy, it is indicated that the receipts for the government during the next year will be \$451,000,000 more than the expenditures. To be exact, the receipts are estimated at \$4,154,000,000 and the expenses at \$3,703,000,000.

"Unquestionably," said Chairman Good, of the House Appropriations Committee, in explanation of Republican policy, "the excess-profit tax is in a large measure passed on to the consumer, and is one of the elements that have tended to keep living costs excessively high. That tax can be repealed, and it ought to be repealed. It may be repealed if living costs are to be reduced in accordance with the demands of the consuming public.
We will not need the revenue that is brought in by excess profits taxes if we keep cutting down appropriations. There is where we can effect a saving. We can avoid the payment of that tax or a substitute tax by a system of economy and national financing of temporary loans, such as our certificates of indebtedness, war savings stamps and Liberty bonds of approximately \$2,000,000,000. Shall we continue to lay this heavy tax upon American industry so as to pay this indebtedness within the next three years, or shall we renege these obligations by loans rather than taxes. I believe our taxes have become such a load upon industry that they are harmful from the viewpoint of the standpoint of national production, and that these maturing obligations can best be met by borrowing the money with which to pay them." Good estimates that the next year's

income will be gained from a protective tariff which will yield \$400,000,000 in 1921, \$1,200,000,000 from income and corporation taxes, \$1,100,000,000 from miscellaneous taxes, \$200,000,000 from miscellaneous revenues.

He would reduce the tax on cotton to 10 cents and wool to 10 cents per gallon on 400,000,000 gallons of wool, and reduce the tax on cigars and tobacco to 10 cents on 100,000,000 cigars and 10 cents on 100,000,000 cigars, and place a higher tax on luxuries.
