Hon. C. E. Woodson returned Friday evening from a visit to Eugene where he was called to attend a meeting of the board of regents of the University of Oregon.

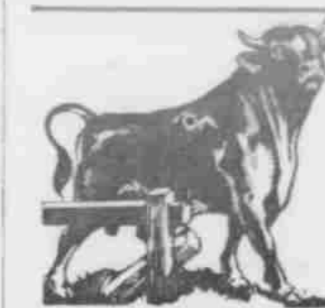
John B. Egan who is a very successful farmer of Piper's canon was doing business in this city on Saturday. He was in the city on Saturday to see his family.
