July Term County Court Proceedings

County Court met in regular session at Heppner, Oregon, July 6th, 1921, with the following officers present: Hon. W. T. Campbell, judge; G. A. Bleakman, commissioner; L. P. Davidson, commissioner; Geo. McDuffee, sheriff; J. A. Waters, clerk; when among others the following proceedings were had:
In the matter of claims against Morrow County, the following claims were presented to the Court and after due consideration of the same were allowed and ordered paid. (See list following.)

In this matter of county warrants: Now at this time is presented to the Court by the County Clerk a list of Morrow County warrants which have been drawn for more than seven years and remain uncalled for as follows: No. 2563 for \$14.55, No. 362 for \$1.70, No. 279 for \$3.00, No. 2479 for \$1.75 and No. 911 for \$1.50. County Clerk ordered to advertise these warrants and if not called for within 60 days, Court would cancel same.

The following Morrow County road warrants cancelled, same having been issued in error: No. 5662, \$77.18; No. 5663, \$72.42; No. 5664, \$90.00 and No. 5665, \$100.00.

In the matter of the road petition of W. F. Barnett et al: Viewers reported road and referred to District Attorney. All other petitions were continued for all terms.

County Court adjourned to meet tomorrow morning at 9 a. m.

July 7, 9 a. m. Court met with same officers present as of previous day.

In the matter of road petition of W. F. Barnett et al: Viewers report given second reading and continued until July 20th, 1921.

In the matter of transfer of funds: Court ordered that \$3500.00 be transferred from General County Fund to Market Road Fund, same being taxes due Market Road Fund from General Fund.

Court ordered that \$1,000.00 be charged against the Market Road Fund on Rhea creek to cover the wear and tear of machinery used in construction of the Market Road.

There being no further business court adjourned to meet July 20th, 1921, at 10 a. m.
