NEW ISSUE OF TREASURY SAVINGS CERTIFICATES

Office of Postmaster General, Wash-
ington, December 13, 1921.

Beginning December 15, 1921, the Un-
ited States government offers for sale
through the Post office department a
new issue of United States Treasury
savings certificates in \$5, \$10, and \$1-
00 denominations. The \$5 and \$100
certificates will be supplied to post-
masters at all Offices of the presiden-
tial grade. The sale of the \$1,000 cer-
tificates will be confined for the present
to the larger first-class offices.

The new certificates possess import-
ant advantages for the investor, as
compared with previous issues, and the
government counts on the loyal and
earnest service of postmasters, so often
proved in response to previous calls, to
bring these advantages home to the
purchasing public.

Until further notice the selling price
of the new certificates will be \$20, \$50,
and \$100, respectively, for the three de-
nominations. These prices are flat and
will not change from month to month.

as in the case of previous issues. The
certificates will mature five years from
the date of issue in every case.

Payment before maturity will be
made by the Treasury Department (not
at or through the post offices) at a rate
specified for every month in tables
printed on the certificates.

The legal limit has been raised from
\$1,000 to \$5,000, effective November 23,
1921. It is not lawful for any person
at any one time to hold certificates of
any annual series to an aggregate amount
exceeding \$5,000 maturity value.

The certificates issued within a calen-
dar year will constitute one series, and
certificates of the new issue sold in
December, 1921, will be considered as of
the 1921 series. Thus, a person who
does not already hold war savings cer-
tificates of the 1921 series may buy \$5,000
maturity value of the new issue in
December, 1921, and \$5,000 additional
in 1922.

Detailed instructions by the Third
Assistant Postmaster General have been
inclosed with the initial supply of
Treasury savings certificates of the
new issue sent to the postmasters at
all accounting offices. These instruc-
tions will be published as a convenience
for the saving of small amounts.

I heartily invite the cooperation of
all postmasters and employees of the
Postal Service in the new savings cam-
paign, the aim of which will be to
bring public attention to the advan-
tages of postal savings for depositing
money and Treasury savings securities
for investment.

GRAIN GRADING COURSES

AT O. A. C. JAN. 9 TO 21

How the state and federal supervi-
sion affects farmer, grain dealer, eleva-
tor and warehouse man, and miller will
be covered in detail by Professor Geo.
R. Hyslop in his grain grading course
from January 9 to 21. The course is
designed to meet the needs of these
operators and candidates for inspection

work.
"Bring samples with you and I will
tell you who standard varieties should
be grown in every locality," says Pro-
fessor Hyslop. "Each student brings
the samples is expected to use them
in his class room work."

All students will have an opportunity
to make samples, run moisture tests,
operate the various types of grain
grading machinery and make reports as
though he were a grain dealer.
How to avoid smut losses and dock-
age, and how to determine frosted

grain and other damaged grains and
their value and the advantages of sell-
ing grain free from dockage will be
given special attention. The course
of hard and soft wheat and their value
for milling purposes, how to make a
gluten test, the relation of test weight
to milling quality, the advantages and
disadvantages of handling grain in bulk
and the causes and effects of the mois-
ture changes which take place in grain
from the time it begins to mature until
it passes through storage will be con-
sidered throughout the course.
