Carbon Bisulphide Kills Ants.

Depositions in the pantry or kitchen by small red and black ants may be stopped by application of two tablespoonsful of carbon bisulphide poured down the entrance to the colony. Earth should be firmly pressed over the entrance to hold the fumes inside. Carbon bisulphide is a liquid which changes into a gas when exposed to the air. It is heavier than air and therefore permeates downward through the passages of the colony. Carbon bisulphide is very inflammable and caution in using it while smoking or opening near a stove should be observed.

Prepare for Grass Seeding.

The lawn should be given a rough grade now, preparatory to sowing the grass seed following the first soaking rain, suggests A. L. Peck, professor of landscape gardening at the agricultural college. Sow broadcast at the rate of 1 pound of seed to 300 square feet of lawn area and do not roll. For those who prefer narrow bladed grasses a mixture is suggested consisting of 50 per cent Kentucky bluegrass and 50 per cent red top. If clover is wanted use 40 per cent red top and 10 percent white clover. Sow clover separate from the fine seed. For those who lack experience it is well to mix seed with six to eight times the bulk of sand.

Plant Roses in Fall.

Roses may be planted in the fall for successful growth for home use, according to A. L. Peck, professor of landscape gardening and floriculture. Two year old roses are the best to use as they develop more quickly and give better results. All broken stems and roots are pruned off before planting.
