**WARNING TO THE PUBLIC**  
There are certain lots and parcels of land in the City of Heppner, and particularly in the business district that are kept in such a condition that are reflection on any city. With little effort and pride these conditions could be remedied, and the owners and occupants of these lots have been frequently requested to remove the offensive and unsightly conditions, but so far such requests have been without avail. Ordinance No. 67 of the City of Heppner enacted by the Council on May, 1st 1899, provides, among other things, as follows:  
Section 2.  
Any person or persons who are the owners or in the possession or entitled to the possession of any lot, piece or parcel of land situated within the corporate limits of the City of Heppner and who shall allow or permit any sloop, paperboxes, barrels, manure, wood, trash, scraps, refuse, rubbish, offal or filth to remain or be on said lot, piece or parcel of land, on any street or alley within said city abutting said lot, piece or parcel of land, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$5.00, nor more than \$50.00, or by imprisonment in the city jail less than two days nor more than twenty-five days.  
Section 4.  
Any person or persons who are the owners or in the possession or entitled to the possession of any cellar, cesspool or water closet or privy or pool of water within the corporate limits of the City of Heppner, who shall allow or permit said cellar, cesspool, privy or pool of water to become or remain offensive or unwholesome shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$5.00, nor more than \$50.00, or by imprisonment in the city jail not less than two days nor more than twenty-five days.  
I have been ordered by the City Council to call attention to these conditions for the last time, and if those lots and parcel of land are not cleaned and kept cleaned, and the privies and cesspools are not cleaned and made unoffensive by the 10th day of November, I shall file complaints and prosecute all persons keeping their lots in such a condition.
