Mr. G. A. Blackman was appointed Justice of the Peace for Dist. No. 1, to fill the unexpired term of Jap Walker, resigned, or until his successor is elected and qualified.

J. A. Waters, County Clerk, presented his resignation to the Court, same to take effect April 1, 1923, or as soon thereafter as his successor is appointed and qualified.
