FARM POINTERS

Alfalfa is ready to cut for hay when the new shoots bud out from below or when the crop is about one-third in bloom. Delay in cutting when the new stems are coming up sets back the next crop several days. Letting the alfalfa go into late bloom makes coarse hay.—O. A. C. Experiment station.

Success with corn depends much on getting a good start. Plant plenty of good seed—12 to 15 pounds an acre if it is good—in warm ground and do not cover too deeply.—O. A. C. Experiment station.

Favorable conditions now prevail in the dairy industry, due to better conditions and increased export trade in the United States during the last year. Prices of dairy products average higher than last year, because of the increase in the buying power of laboring men. Production is showing considerable increase but it is believed that consumption will keep pace except for seasonal surplus.—O. A. C. Experiment station.

Dairy cows of Oregon have taken seriously the agitation for better protection for animal, and have increased their individual production 17 per cent in the last 10 years.—O. A. C. Experiment station.

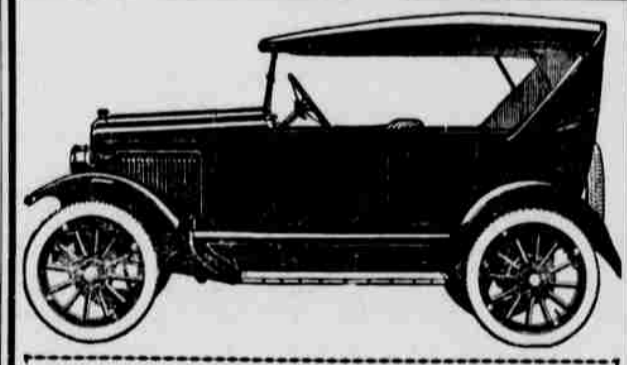
