LOCAL BOY GRADUATES
Oregon Agricultural College, Corvallis, May 16.—Edward A. Notson is on the list of candidates for graduation this spring. He is a graduate of Heppner high school. While attending high school at Dunlap, Iowa, he was student body president for three years and played football, basketball and ran on the track team. He will receive his degree in civil engineering.

Approximately 515 students will be graduated in Notson's class. This will be the largest number of students to receive diplomas in the history of the institution. The combined schools of engineering will graduate 131, agriculture 112, com-

merce 93, home economics 41, vocational education 27, and forestry 17, while smaller numbers will receive their degrees from other schools in the college.

\$11,000 Given Medical School by Junior League

University of Oregon, Eugene, May 16.—Eleven thousand dollars, raised by the Junior League of Portland, has been dedicated to the support of the Children's orthopedic clinic of the University of Oregon School of Medicine. The clinic is held in the out patient department of the medical school at the Portland Free Dispensary.

The Junior League is composed of philanthropic young women of Portland who recently gave two entertainments to aid the clinic, which yielded the sum of about \$5500. This, together with a previous sum of \$5500, brought the total to \$11,000. The League has purchased all of the necessary equipment for the clinic and is employing a masseuse who has taken over the work of massage, corrective exercises for spinal deformity and other physical treatment for children. Members of the League personally participate in the work.
