

FARM POINTERS

(From O. A. C. Experiment Station.)
For soil and water control, alfalfa is one of the best. It is generally used but must be planted in the fall. It is a good idea to use a little alfalfa in the spring.

Field peas like most legumes respond to land plaster or sulfur. Use 25 to 35 pounds land plaster per acre. In districts where sulfur gives good results an alfalfa. It is a good idea to use a little on the peas early in the spring.

The cherry fruit fly comes out of the ground at Royal Ann cherries are turning red—from new till after middle of June. This is the only time it can be controlled—while it is hatching about the trees and looking up the honey dew. The fly is two-thirds the size of the common house fly, dark with yellow head and legs and cross band or picture on the wings. The following sweetened poison bait spray will "get it": Lead arsenate a half pound, molasses or syrup—never honey—2 quarts, water 10 gallons. This is enough for about 10 trees.

Wilted potato plants should be dug out of the field designed for certification. If it is a case of plain wilt the plants on each side are best taken out, as the disease spreads through the soil and is almost sure to infect plants closer than two feet. Vegetable growers who water their crops may grow at least two crops a year on the same ground. The first crop is such as lettuce, peas, spinach, radishes, spring lettuce and early cabbage. The follow-up crop may be such as late beans, late sweet corn, fall lettuce, the extra fall spinach, or celery. The water is especially valuable for the second crop either to aid seed germination or help the transplant get established.
