Morrow county will have a bumper wheat crop, says Henry J. Taylor, after a motor trip to that county. He says some of the fields look excellent but others show considerable mustard. The trip was the first made to Morrow county by Mr. Taylor since his election as joint senator and he received a number of compliments because of the stand he took in the last legislature. He was accompanied to Heppner by Mrs. Taylor—East Oregonian.

Mr. Pieper states that their harvest will begin in about three weeks, the crop being practically matured now and if the cooler weather will just hold on a few days longer the quality of the grain will be No. 1.
