He will harvest 1700 acres and expects an average yield of 25 bushels.

John Healey was in from Whitney where he has his sheep on summer range, to spend the week end with his family. He states that the grass was never better in the mountains than this season and sheep are doing fine. Rains most every day and there is an abundance of moisture.

W. B. Tucker was in town for a few hours on Monday. He is getting in to his harvest this week and will be a busy man for some time putting the grain in the sack. His wheat gives promise of a fine yield, this being true of most of the Blackhorse section.
