Seation 2. Any person, firm or cor poration desiring a literane to sell, dispose of or keep for sale any milk or cream within the City of Hoppner, Oregon, shall first make application to the City Recorder, which application shall set forth with camenable certainty the following. certainty the following:

(1) The name and place of loca-tion of the applicant, the location of the dairy, or plans where such milk or eream is produced, if such person, firm or corporation produces such milk or cream, if not, then the name and location of the person from whom such milk or cream is procured.

(2) That such applicant has a cer-ficute from the State Food and Dair Commissioner, showing:
