

FARM POINTERS

From O. A. C. Experiment Station.) Results from crop rotation are not very marked at first. In a rotation experiment of the Oregon Agricultural college experiment station farm which has been going for 10 years, grain continuously yielded 30 bushels of barley to the acre. On the same soil which had a rotation that included a legume crop the yield of barley this year was 61 bushels to the acre. The following rotation is recommended by the dairy department of the O. A. C. experiment station, as-Results from crop rotation are no

seed oil meal, cottonseed meal or cocoanut meal, one pound of this feed per day being allowed for each 1 1-2 pounds of milk produced. If kale is available it may be fed in addition to other feeds with excellent results.
