Then came the great pressure on the city folks due to the enormous increase in rents. The rush for the open found the country ready for the absorption without any pressing necessity to increase the number of homes.

The result is that country properties have been turned from obligations into valuable income producing assets. The fact that city rents are still abnormally high insures the safety of the country districts. In the suburbs of the larger centers it is an accepted fact that the advance in values is now established on a permanent higher level.

Once the city man tastes the glories of sunshine and gets a whiff of new mown hay, the call of the cabaret and the white lights make little or no appeal. Country life, like country newspapers, need only to be tried to be appreciated.
