Pacific Cooperative Wool Growers Close Valley Pool

The Pacific Cooperative Wool Growers has closed its fourth annual Willamette Valley wool pool and disbursed the proceeds of sales to its members in that district.

Despite the fact that prices in the Valley generally ranged lower than last year, the association was able to get a better average price for its members than was the case in 1923.

Growers of the coarser grades of wool such as low quarter and braid were greatly benefitted by an improvement in the market for that class of wool which is much in evidence with many farm flocks in the Valley.

The association had previously closed its mohair pool, and in due course will close its pool for the farm flock and crossbred Eastern Oregon and Idaho pool as well as the pool of wool in California and the shipments by range growers.

It is handling this year approximately three and a half million pounds of wool and mohair grown in Oregon, Washington, Idaho and California.
