As is usual in Morrow county, the general election passed off very quietly. There was a keen interest, however, in candidates and measures, and combined with a good day, the vote was large. Enthusiastic workers of Senator Le Follette expected that he would come close to carrying the county, but these hopes President Coolidge never seemed to think that there could be any other result than that which happened. Mr. Davis was third in the primary and failed to carry the full strength of his party in the county. The local candidates for sheriff and county school superintendent seemed to create the most interest, the latter being a three-cornered fight and the final outcome was pretty close. There was no lack of interest, either, in the contest for county judge, though this race was carried on in a very dignified manner between Mr. Campbell and Mr. Beuge. The barbers of Mr. Ball manifest quite keen disappointment in the outcome of the fight over the office of sheriff, and this was really the most hotly contested race. Sheriff McDuffee received a strong endorsement, however, and it would seem from this he will have the backing in the performance of his official duties that he is entitled to. If there be some sore spots because of the results, these will soon heal and will be forgotten as is always the

case, and everything will move along in the usual way. The repeal of the income tax was sustained in Morrow county, but the vote on the measure was close. The proposed amendment to the Workmen's Compensation law was defeated by a two-to-one vote, while the oleomargarine law was sustained here by a fair majority.

In justice to the Lexington high school and Prof. Kelly, we desire to correct our figures given in last issue in the writ-up concerning the Wason-Lexington game. We stated that Lexington had been scored against nine to the extent of nine points. We are informed that their team has not been scored against this season. Our informant gave us the figures over the telephone hence the mistake on our part, which was entirely unintentional. While speaking of this, it is well for those interested in these matters to see that we get these figures written down, and in that case there will be no need of making mistakes of this sort.

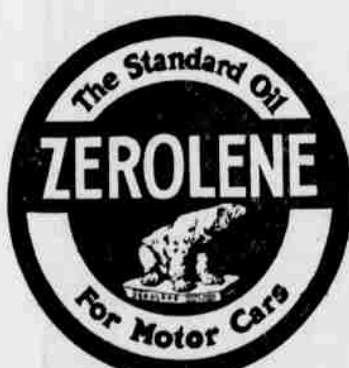

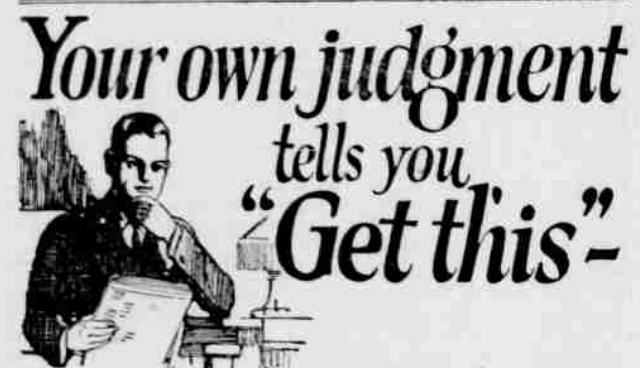
