disposition on the part of the coming legislature to do away with the office of prohibition director in this state, due, no doubt, to the unpopularity of Geo. L. Cleaver, the present incumbent. There is no small amount of propaganda along this line. Yet any man in that place would be unpopular, especially with those who desire to enforce the prohibition law. Cleaver seems to have tried hard to enforce the law, and appears to be honest in his efforts along that line, and no doubt the more nearly he succeeds, the less popular he becomes with the bootleggers and moonshiners and all who are their patrons. We have a strong element in the state who do not desire to see the prohibition law enforced; we have them right here in Morrow county, and events of recent date are evidence of the truth of the statement that no enforcing officer is popular, no difference what methods he may use to enforce the law. Cleaver has become unpopular, it is true, and Governor Pierce might be induced to put a better man in his place, but we do not believe the people of the state will stand for doing away with this office. The Oregon prohibition law requires that there be a state director to aid in its enforcement. It can't be left to the federal and county officers entirely.
