Respect for Law.

MANY writers and speakers have been seen to dwell on the fact that in a growing democracy for all law is important, the liquor laws are quoted. Violations are frequently condoned and a habit of mind is created...

A more forceful illustration of this point could not be found than in a recent number of the Oregon Motorist, owned and published by the Oregon State Motor Association, which deliberately sets itself down as an advocate of lawlessness.

Every motorist can help put an end to the speed trap evil by joining the motor association while such conditions are permitted to exist.

The list consists of the names of drivers arrested, the speed at which they were "alleged" to be traveling at the city limits and the fine levied against each.

State law permits a speed not to exceed 30 miles an hour on highways outside of cities and 20 miles in cities. By the record, every person of the 139 was violating the law when arrested.

If the law is undesirable, let it be changed. But for the present it is the law and the same as every other law on the statute books—entirely enforceable.
